

Outdoor Worship Approved by Session to Begin Sunday, August 30 (Fifth Sunday)



At its July 28 meeting, Session addressed recommendations from internal task forces charged with developing protocols for a possible return to in-person gatherings. Session has approved a new 8:30 a.m. Sunday outdoor worship service to be held on the paved area between the Commons Lobby and Sanctuary, near the Blessing Box. This is an outside event and weather dependent. Staff will post any cancellation on the church website by 7:30 a.m. Sunday morning.

Worship will be approx. 30 minutes with an abbreviated Order of Worship. Worshipers will stand, bring their own lawn chairs and/or

sit in a parked car. There will be no access to church buildings or restrooms. As with any activity, individuals are asked to remain at home if they have a temperature of 100.4° or above and/or multiple COVID-19 risk factors. Masks are required upon entering the FPC grounds until departing (please bring your own) and physical distancing will be strictly observed (6 feet, other than among family members). Hand sanitizer will be available and participants will be asked to sign a one-time Waiver and Health Screening Questionnaire as part of a pre-registration process. Both forms and pre-registration may be easily completed online.

We'll likely maintain this schedule through the end of October, taking advantage of our beautiful weather. Watch for details in the coming weeks, as we thoughtfully plan this return to a healthy and safe worship experience. *The 9:30 a.m. live stream will remain unchanged.*
